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## I. Executive Summary

MED-Project LLC ("MED-Project") operates a Product Stewardship Plan for Unwanted Medicine from Households ("Plan") in the County of Alameda ("Jurisdiction") under the Alameda County General Ordinance Code, Chapter 6.53, the Alameda County Safe Drug Disposal Ordinance ("Ordinance") and the Alameda County Safe Drug Disposal Regulations ("Regulations"). This 2019 County of Alameda Annual Report ("Report") describes the activities of MED-Project between January 1, 2019, and December 31, 2019 (the "Reporting Period") in compliance with Ordinance Section 6.53.080. All capitalized terminology not defined in this Report is derived from the approved Plan dated February 15, 2019, and amended March 27, 2019.

MED-Project began collection in 2015 under the initial Plan, dated January 30, 2015, and approved on February 25, 2015. An Updated Plan was submitted on February 15, 2019, amended on March 27, 2019, and approved by the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (the "Department") on April 5, 2019.

A notice of temporary closure of a disposal facility was sent on October 4, 2019, informing the Jurisdiction of the alternative disposal facilities to be used during the facility's maintenance closure. The facility subsequently resumed operations in February 2020.

During 2019, priority was given to performing outreach to eligible pharmacies and Law Enforcement Agencies ("LEAs") throughout the Jurisdiction and establishing Kiosk Drop-Off Sites throughout the Jurisdiction. As a result of these efforts, MED-Project's Program collected and disposed of "Unwanted Medicine" (as defined in Plan Section IV) from 73 Kiosk Drop-Off Sites (77 kiosks), eight Take-Back Events, and through the addition of Mail-Back Services beginning July 4, 2019.

Kiosks were installed in pharmacies and hospital/clinics with an onsite pharmacy that meet all local, state, and federal requirements and that executed agreements with MED-Project. In addition, outreach and educational materials, including signage and/or brochures, were distributed to all newly activated Kiosk Drop-Off Sites.

MED-Project provided disposal instructions for Kiosk Drop-Off Sites, Take-Back Events, and Mail-Back Services to Residents and continues to communicate with Kiosk Drop-Off Site Hosts to distribute outreach materials upon request, review procedures as needed, and improve overall Program design.

As outlined in the approved Plan, the ultimate goal of the Program is to provide Jurisdiction Residents with convenient, safe, and accessible methods to dispose of Unwanted Medicine. MED-Project anticipates an increase in Kiosk Drop-Off Sites throughout 2020 as a result of ongoing outreach and Program activities, especially if there is increased retail chain pharmacy participation in the Program.

- MED-Project collected a total of 52,927.10 pounds of Unwanted Medicine through Kiosk Drop-Off Sites.

- MED-Project collected 0.50 pounds of Unwanted Medicine through the return of Inhaler Mail-Back Packages.
- MED-Project collected 3.27 pounds of Unwanted Medicine through the return of Standard Mail-Back Packages.
- MED-Project collected a total of 3.77 pounds of Unwanted Medicine through the return of Mail-Back Packages during the Reporting Period.

### C. Take-Back Events

- MED-Project collected a total of 2,462.10 pounds of Unwanted Medicine through collection at Take-Back Events.

### D. Total Weight of Collected Unwanted Medicine

- MED-Project collected a total of 55,392.97 pounds of Unwanted Medicine through all methods.

### A. Public Education Activities

MED-Project provided disposal instructions for Kiosk Drop-Off Sites, Take-Back Events, and Mail-Back Services to Residents during the Reporting Period. In addition, MED-Project maintained the MED-Project Website and toll-free Call Center to provide information pertaining to MED-Project disposal options and outreach materials. The website, toll-free number, and outreach materials, such as posters and brochures, were available in English, Spanish, Chinese, Tagalog, and Vietnamese. ### B. Outreach Activities

MED-Project conducted the following outreach activities during the Reporting Period: provided print, broadcast television, radio, and digital advertising campaigns; distributed signage and brochures; participated in the Oakland Healthy Living Festival where flyers were distributed; posted information on social media sites and to the MED-Project Website, and sent email blasts. See Appendix K for brochure and poster distribution information. A list of the social media and email outreach promotion activity is provided in Appendix L. The reach percentage for each campaign is provided in the Media Outreach Summary. See Appendix M.

### C. Evaluation Activities

Per the current approved Plan, MED-Project will conduct a biennial survey of Residents, pharmacists, and health professionals in the Jurisdiction who interact with patients to measure Program awareness and to evaluate the effectiveness of its education and outreach activities.

## **A. Collection Goals**

Short-term collection goals, as outlined in the approved Plan, were met with the implementation of Mail-Back Services for disabled and home-bound Residents, persons providing services to such Residents, and Residents in underserved areas of the County.

MED-Project continues to strive to meet the long-term goals to include the expansion of kiosk placement to additional eligible LEAs and retail and chain pharmacies with a long-term goal of establishing up to 100 Kiosk Drop-Off Sites while reducing collection through Take-Back Events. In coordination with household hazardous waste (HHW) events, MED-Project held eight Take-Back Events during 2019.

In 2019, law enforcement oversight of Take-Back Events was performed by the Alameda County Sheriff's Office for all eight of the Take-Back Events with collection of Unwanted Medicine. See Appendix D for more details.




Figure 1: Map of Existing Kiosk Drop-Off Sites

Refer to Sections III and VI of this Report for specific collection information. Figure 1 shows a graphical representation of how MED-Project strives to meet service convenience and collection goals during the Reporting Period.

## **B. Education and Public Outreach Goals**

MED-Project met the Plan's short-term goals, including adding Mail-Back Services to the Call Center and MED-Project Website for disabled and home-bound Residents, persons providing services to such Residents, and Residents in underserved areas of the County.

Additionally, a multilingual MED-Project Call Center and MED-Project Website were implemented within 90 days of the approved Plan in the Specified Languages.

MED-Project released a Public Service Announcement ("PSA") animation directed at Residents on social media websites, digital media, and broadcast television platforms.

On an ongoing basis, MED-Project may revise and add communications materials based on changes to the Plan.

## **C. Collector Outreach**

MED-Project performed periodic outreach to potential eligible Kiosk Drop-Off Sites such as making phone calls, sending emails and letters, and conducting in-person site visits. Interested non-participating sites were contacted monthly until either the site began participating in the Program or the site indicated they no longer wanted to be considered for participation.

MED-Project's long-term goals include ongoing communication with pharmacies and LEAs and periodic evaluation and monitoring of participating Kiosk Drop-Off Sites.

## Appendix F

### Plan Deviation Report

#### **Event 1:** Notice of Change in Disposal Facility for Unwanted Medicine Boxes and Liners

**Date:** March 29, 2019

**Description:** MED-Project was notified on March 28, 2019 that a Heritage Thermal Services East Liverpool destruction appointment was cancelled. As a result of the cancellation, Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners managed as part of the Plan needed to be destroyed at a back-up destruction facility. Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners were destroyed at the Stericycle, Inc. Warren Ohio Facility on April 2, 2019.

Vendor reported that the action to send Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners to the Stericycle, Inc. Warren Ohio Facility was due to destruction appointment cancellations at Heritage Thermal Services East Liverpool in March 2019.

**Corrective Action Taken:** Upon being notified of these issues by Vendor, MED-Project: (1) confirmed with Vendor that Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners remained securely stored; (2) requested the complete inventory of impacted Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners; and (3) approved Vendor proposed plans to destroy Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners as soon as practicable at the Stericycle, Inc. Warren Ohio Facility, because the Veolia - Port Arthur Facility was unavailable.

Vendor notified MED-Project that capacity limits was a contributing factor to the destruction appointment cancellation and that the Heritage Thermal Services East Liverpool Facility had reached capacity for taking Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners for the scheduled appointment. MED-Project is working with the Vendor to approve additional disposal facilities in order to reduce the volume of Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners being disposed of at the Heritage Thermal Services East Liverpool Facility and the Veolia - Port Arthur Facility.

MED-Project submitted an updated Product Stewardship Plan for Unwanted Medicine from Households on February 15, 2019, and revised on March 27, 2019, requesting addition of the Stericycle, Inc. Warren Ohio Facility for disposal of Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners. This updated plan was approved on April 5, 2019.

#### **Event 2:** Vendor Incinerator Outage

**Date:** October 7, 2019

**Description:** MED-Project notified the Department on October 4, 2019 that Stericycle, Inc.'s Warren Ohio Facility would be temporarily shut down for routine maintenance on October 7, 2019. During the routine maintenance period Standard Mail-Back Packages and Inhaler Mail-Back Packages were destroyed at the Heritage Thermal Services East Liverpool Facility in compliance with all applicable laws. Vendor notified MED-Project on February 12, 2020 that the Stericycle, Inc. Warren Ohio Facility resumed operations on February 3, 2020.

**Corrective Action Taken:** MED-Project continues to work with the Department and vendors to increase the approved destruction facility options included in the Program.

**Event 3: Unwanted Medicine Boxes and Liners Exceeded MED-Project Destruction Policy****Date:** August 2019 – December 2019

**Description:** Vendor reported on February 26, 2020 that Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners located at the Indianapolis reverse distribution facility were stored in excess of MED-Project policy as a result of facility throughput increases, which were further effected by the Stericycle, Inc. Warren Ohio Facility planned maintenance shutdown. Vendor reported that it will complete any applicable DEA reporting related to the shipments per CFR Title 21 Part 1301.74. The number of affected Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners is provided in the table below.

**Corrective Action Taken:** Vendor reported that, in addition to resuming operation at the Stericycle, Inc. Warren Ohio Facility, additional monthly destruction appointments were secured with other destruction facilities approved in the Plan. The Vendor reported that training was conducted with the applicable Vendor staff on DEA destruction requirements. Vendor will provide MED-Project reports to identify Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners in storage for more than 14 days after receipt by Vendor. The Vendor will communicate a destruction schedule in writing to MED-Project in the event there are Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners in storage more than 23 days after receipt by Vendor.

**Event 4: Host Site Shipment Schedule Plan Discrepancy****Date:** 2019

**Description:** 95% of Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners were picked up within two business days of Unwanted Medicine box and liner preparation for shipment. The Unwanted Medicine box and liner preparation initiates scheduled pick-up by the Carrier. Over 99% of the Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners were picked up within four business days of scheduled pick-up. MED-Project instituted weekly Unwanted Medicine box and liner pick-up schedule metric reviews with the Vendor and notes that same day pick-up over the year improved from 22% to 34% of pick-ups

**Corrective Action Taken:** MED-Project is continuing to monitor the Carrier scheduled Unwanted Medicine box and liner pick-up performance and is working with the Vendor to improve Carrier pick-up coordination and scheduling. MED-Project identified that holiday periods caused pick-up delays due to seasonal shipping volume fluctuations and worked with the Vendor to flex service dates to avoid the need for holiday pick-up days where possible. MED-Project is also in the process of instituting measures to provide additional information to the Carrier, via the Vendor, to address the timing when Host Site employees are available for pick-ups. MED-Project continues to monitor feedback from Host Sites to determine if they are experiencing inconvenience as a result of the pick-up delays and continues to work with sites to identify solutions, such as providing a second storage kiosk, where needed, to provide safe and secure storage of Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners.

## Appendix G

### Safety and Security Report

#### **Event 1:** Host Site Shipping Discrepancy

**Date:** February 14, 2019

**Description:** On February 21, 2019, MED-Project's Vendor reported to MED-Project that an Unwanted Medicine box and liner prepared for shipment on February 14, 2019 had not been picked-up by the Carrier. Upon receipt of this report, MED-Project contacted the host site. The host site confirmed to MED-Project that the Unwanted Medicine box and liner was no longer in the host site's custody. A police investigation was opened and ultimately suspended with no findings.

**Corrective Action Taken:** MED-Project requested that the host site preserve and share with MED-Project records and information related to the Unwanted Medicine box and liner at issue.

MED-Project requested that the Vendor provide all information available about the event including: (1) reviewing any similar incidents; (2) any trends of similar issues; (3) efforts to address any potential security or data gaps identified as a result of this event; and (4) any conclusions from internal inquiries related to this event.

The Vendor notified MED-Project that the Carrier put an alert on the Unwanted Medicine box and liner tracking number.

The host site and MED-Project reviewed Unwanted Medicine box and liner management procedures. The host site reported that it changed its storage practices.

MED-Project issued additional Unwanted Medicine box and liner instructions to all host sites.

MED-Project assessed its processes with a transportation security expert and a former DEA agent and the Vendor has instituted measures to monitor and report potential in-transit Unwanted Medicine box and liner shipment discrepancies.

#### **Event 2:** Reverse Distributor Receiving Discrepancy

**Date:** July 17, 2019

**Description:** On November 14, 2019, the Vendor notified MED-Project that Carrier tracking data suggest the Carrier delivered an Alameda County collection site Unwanted Medicine box and liner to Vendor's reverse distributor location on July 17, 2019, and that Vendor's data do not indicate receipt of this Unwanted Medicine box and liner. The Vendor performed an investigation and concluded that the Unwanted Medicine box and liner were likely properly destroyed.


**Corrective Action Taken:** The Vendor reported that facility camera footage was reviewed and that a physical sweep of the warehouse was completed. The Vendor further reported that: (1) receiving protocols were reviewed for potential gaps, (2) staff re-training was conducted on the proper handling and processing of Unwanted Medicine boxes and liners, and (3) a manual reconciliation process was added to the receiving protocols. The Vendor also reported that its DEA reporting requirements are consistent with CFR Title 21 Part 1301.74.

In addition to the receiving system improvements, the Vendor instituted measures to monitor and report potential in-transit Unwanted Medicine box and liner shipment discrepancies.




Figure 17: MED-Project Website Landing Page (December 2019)




Figure 22: MED-Project Website In-Home Disposal Page (December 2019)




Figure 23: MED-Project Website MEDinfo Page (December 2019)




Figure 24: MED-Project Website MEDfaq Page (December 2019)




Figure 25: MED-Project Website Contact Page (December 2019)
