**NOTICE OF DETERMINATION**

**INMAR Product Stewardship Program Plan dated March 04, 2022.**

Dear Mr. Massaro,

The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (Department) reviewed the March 04, 2022, INMAR INTELLIGENCE + LIFE IN CHECK document entitled "Product Stewardship Program Plan for all Unwanted Product" (the "Plan"), a revision of the original INMAR product stewardship plan dated April 10, 2020, submitted previously to the Department. The Plan proposes to collect and dispose of all consumer-generated covered drugs from households within Alameda County as specified in the Alameda County Safe Drug Disposal Ordinance and Regulations. Public comments provided orally and in writing at or prior to the public hearing on March 16, 2022, have been considered. Conditions one through three below were recommended by staff prior to the public hearing and agreed to by INMAR during the public hearing.


The March 04, 2022 Plan is APPROVED with the following Conditions of Approval:

1. No part of the Plan shall be confidential. INMAR shall submit an updated Plan with the confidentially markings removed, including but not limited to the cover page and the footers. Any trademarking may remain.
2. INMAR shall submit a report with the names of all the producers participating in the Plan within thirty (30) days of the date of this letter and an updated list within ninety (90) days.
3. To confirm that the Plan is providing sufficient collection methods, a report that provides a status update with the number of producers and how the collection methods correlate with the quantity of product produced by the producers participating in the Plan, shall be submitted no later than ninety (90) days from the date of this letter.
4. To confirm that the Plan continues to be adequate for the number of producers participating in the Plan and consistent with the amount of product that those producers bring into the County, INMAR will meet with the County monthly, or as otherwise mutually agreed by the County and INMAR, and discuss collection methods, including but not limited to increasing mail back, kiosks and collection events for the underserved areas in the County.

The Plan approval date is April 1, 2022.

The reporting period is from January 1 to December 31 of each year. The first Annual report is due on or before March 1, 2023. Subsequent Annual Reports are due March 1 of each year.
